### WORDS ABOUT WORSHIP

It's a month of parties! While December marks the end of the calendar year, November marks the end of the Christian liturgical year. "But, what is the Christian liturgical year?" We're so glad you asked! The liturgical year is what shapes our worship life in the Christian church. The year begins in the season of Advent, the four weeks prior to Christmas while we await the coming of Christ. Following Christmas is Epiphany, Lent, Easter, and Pentecost (with a lot of other celebrations and recognitions mixed in, but we'll get to that at a later time).

So here we are surrounded by numerous festival Sundays. We celebrate Reformation Sunday on October 30, and then All Saints Sunday on November 6. All Saints is an opportunity to remind ourselves that the church is not only the communion of those around us who are living, but a communion that includes those who have died. Because Jesus Christ conquered death, we celebrate that death cannot divide us from the body of Christ. We can stand strong in our faith knowing that we are supported and encouraged by the many who have gone before us. On All Saints Sunday in worship we hear the names of those in our congregation who have died in the past year. We also hear the names of those baptized in the previous year, knowing that we have been baptized into the death of Jesus so that we are resurrected into the life of Jesus.

November 20 concludes the liturgical year with the festival of Christ the King. On this Sunday we celebrate Jesus' conquering death for all of us, and his reign in our lives. There is no better news than that!

We recognize these festival Sundays with grand music, processions, new

## THE EMPTY CHAIR... WHO CAN FILL IT?

The main point of entry into the life of our congregation is and has been worship. And that is right and proper. But it's not always easy to invite coworkers, neighbors, even family and friends to come to worship with you. I know many of you have done this and our church has grown because of your bravery! But most people find it difficult to say, "Hey, we have a great church and I'd like to invite you to come with me to worship!" And many of those who don't go to church have some strange ideas about what a church is and feel that they might not be accepted, or that church people aren't "like me" and so they are uncomfortable accepting an invitation to worship.

That's why churches need other points of entry. These entry points are the other parts of our life together where we might find it easier to invite someone to "come along" and where the "other" will be comfortable accepting our invitation. Maybe you're part of a group that is going to feed the homeless or to work for a day down at Haven for Hope. Who do you know who might also be interested in that? Could you invite them to join you on that task? Perhaps you're in the Drama Ministry. Do you know someone who might like to try out for the next production? Perhaps you are one of our youth and you're going on a youth group activity, or you're one of our seniors who enjoys the social aspects of the Zippers group. Who do you know that might like



to do that too?

The goal is that when people are invited to "come along" for these other things, they have an opportunity to establish relationships, to get to know us apart from what may seem a high risk situation of coming to worship in a strange place. Once they get to see that we are at least semi-normal people, then perhaps they might be more comfortable accepting an invitation to worship or a Sunday School class. We invite them to get to know us, then we let the Holy Spirit go to work to see what more can happen. We already have quite a

few people active in our church who have come into our community of faith by these other doors.

I would love to see our congregation become a truly inviting church, where it just becomes part of the fabric of who we are. I'd like each of us to constantly picture an empty chair at every event, every activity we do, and ask ourselves, "Who do I know that might enjoy this? Who could I invite to come along?" So please think and pray about this in the weeks ahead. What do you enjoy in our church, outside of worship, that you could invite someone to come along? Who might that be? And then, when people respond and begin to come along, we work at helping them feel at home with us, being a welcoming congregation. Think you can do it? I'll pray you can!

### Do You Know...?

A processional is a visible sign of the community following Christ. As the procession enters into the sanctuary, it is led by the cross as our acknowledgement of Christ's presence among us and leading us. The cross is often flanked by two torches, representing the light of Christ. Immediately following is the Bible, also illuminated by the torches' light, showing its central place in our liturgy. Following in the procession are the leaders of worship, processing in the name of all who gather to worship. A Gospel procession is sometimes used, representing the community's trust that the risen Christ is among us. At the end of the service, Christ leads us out of the church and into the world, living our lives in the name of Christ.
