FALL SUNDAY SCHOOL

Classes have begun, but it is not too late to join the fun!

Children in preschool and elementary classes explore the Bible through stories, songs and age-appropriate activities. The youngest children hear the same story for a month, learning via repetition and a variety of activities. Older children learn at a faster pace, with lessons based on people and events in both the Old and New Testaments, and the lectionary (readings in worship). The variety of styles offers a wonderful opportunity for adults and children to discuss the Bible together.

On the first day of Sunday School, three-year-olds were given Story Bibles. If your child was unable to attend on September 11, Bibles are still available from your child's teacher.

Third Graders were presented with "Spark Bibles" in worship on August 28 during the 11:00am worship service. Again, if your child was unable to attend that worship service, your Bible is available from your child's third grade class teacher. Children in the third through fifth grades should bring their Bibles with them each Sunday, to be used in class.

FALL ADULT CLASSES

Sunday morning adult classes are at 9:30am. Two different types of Bible study are offered.

- **THE SIGNS OF THE KINGDOM** is a lectionary study looking specifically at the Gospel of Matthew as is the New Life study.
- **THE GREATEST STORY** is an overview of the Bible and will concentrate on people, places and events.

Now through January 8**

The Greatest Story is an innovative approach to encountering the Bible. In each session, participants experience the Bible through captivating sand art story presentations. This is an ideal learning experience for all, even those who are new to the Bible.

Journey through the scripture, from Genesis to Revelation, encounter key people, places and events of the Bible, and learn how these stories apply to your life. The class is held in the Fellowship Hall, Sunday mornings at 9:30.
